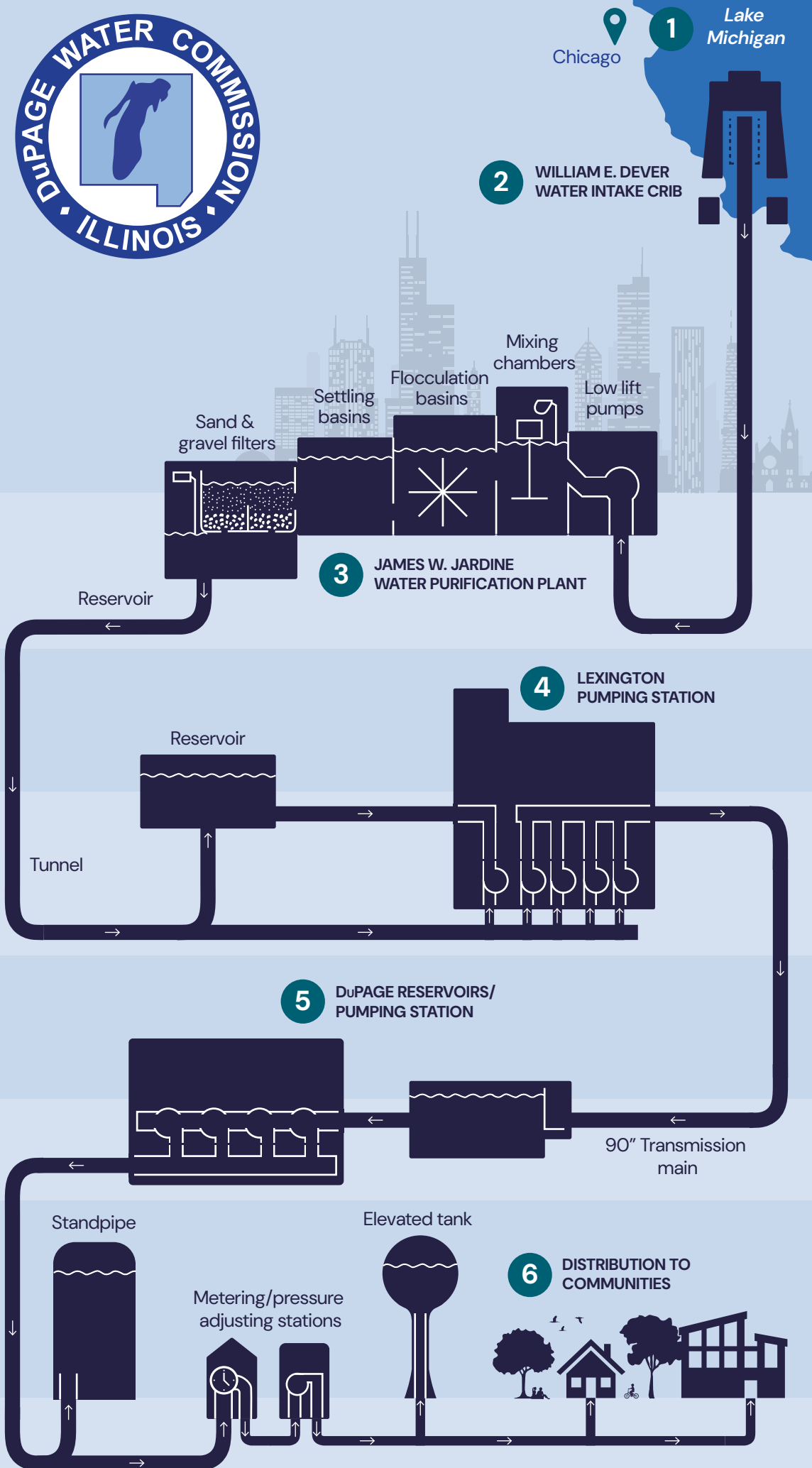




LAKE MICHIGAN – Lake Michigan is the second largest Great Lake by volume and the only one located completely within the US. When combined, the Great Lakes comprise more than 20% of the world's fresh water. More than 8 million Americans rely on Lake Michigan for drinking water each day.

WILLIAM E. DEVER WATER INTAKE CRIB – Located two miles off the Chicago shoreline of Lake Michigan, these intake structures have been serving Northeast Illinois for 100 years.

JAMES W. JARDINE WATER PURIFICATION PLANT – Located next to Navy Pier, this is the largest water treatment plant in the world with capacity to treat 1.4 billion gallons of drinking water daily.

LEXINGTON PUMPING STATION – Since operation commenced in the early 1990's, the Lexington Pump Station has conveyed nearly 1 trillion gallons of Lake Michigan water to DuPage County and surrounding areas.

DUPAGE RESERVOIRS & PUMPING STATION – The reservoirs hold 30 million gallons of water and supplement the water supply during high demand periods. The pumping station houses the DuPage Water Commission's control center responsible for distributing Lake Michigan water to nearly 1 million residents.

DISTRIBUTION TO COMMUNITIES – More than 185 miles of pipes deliver water to the 30 communities served by the DuPage Water Commission.
